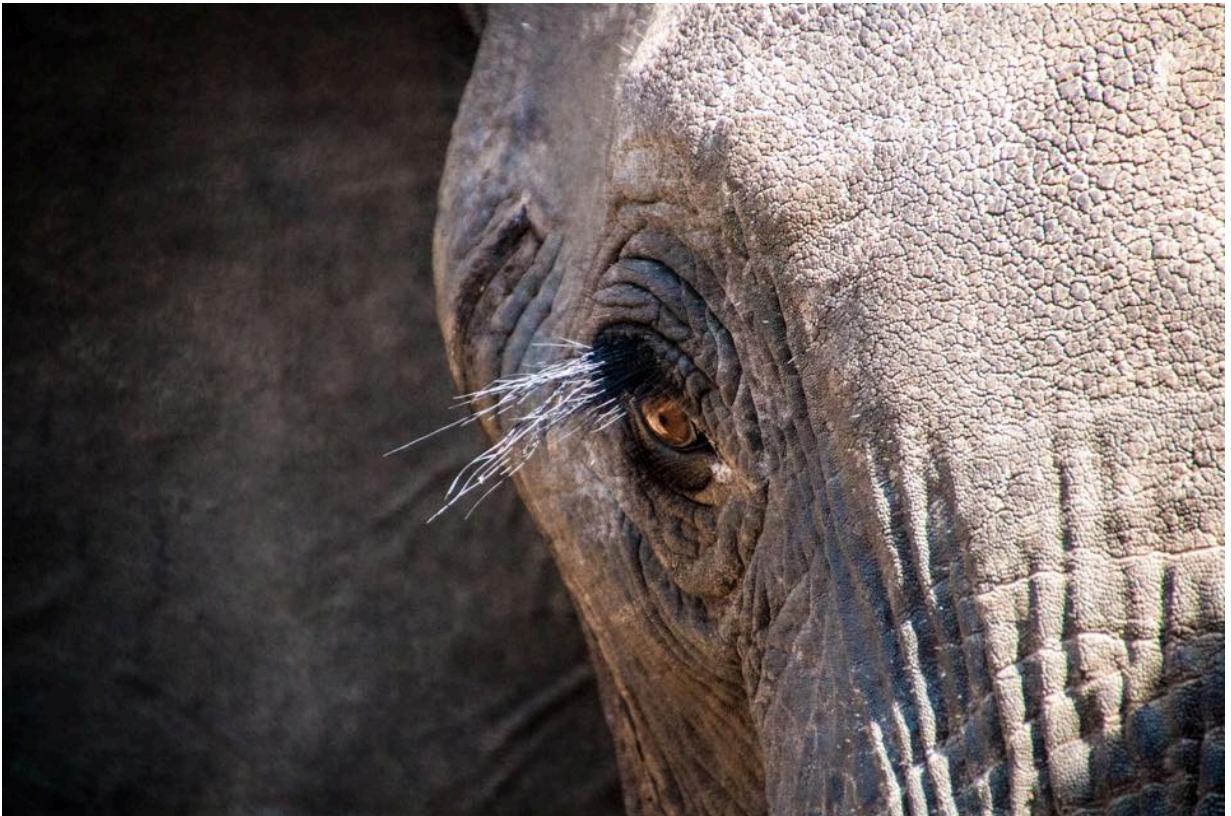


TV stars: Where are they now?
